Annual garden walk, art festival move to virtual format to allow for social distancing measures

Village details events, amenities affected amid COVID-19 pandemic

WILLIAMSVILLE, NY (May 18, 2020) – As the spring and summer festival season approaches, organizers of numerous events that are annually held in the Village of Williamsville are discussing the possibility of either cancellations, postponements, or implementing revised plans for this year's celebrations.

Adjustments to area events are being initiated due to the COVID-19 pandemic and efforts to prevent the spread of the disease through safe social distancing measures.

Garden Walk Williamsville – which is held annually on the third Saturday in July – will not host an in-person event. Instead, organizers will debut a virtual format, providing people with the ability to submit and view social media videos and photographs that will spotlight residential and municipal gardens.

"In an effort to bring the beauty of all gardens to the public, our volunteer committee wants you to share your photos and videos of your own gardens, no matter if you live in the village or not," the village's Garden Walk Committee organizers said in a statement.

Also switching to a virtual format is the Glen Park Art Festival, which was set for the last Saturday and Sunday in July. The in-person festival, which draws thousands of people to Glen Avenue in the village, will not be held this year.

The festival committee will be working with artists and vendors to create a virtual art show by posting links to purchase their works. All of the information will be posted on the Glen Park Art Festival web site by the end of June.

While committee organizers may be amending the 2020 event, they are also looking forward to next year's show.

"Planning for our 2021 festival has already begun," said Connie Haney, co-chair of the festival. "Applications for 2021 will be online in January."

The Glen Park Art Festival Committee is overseen by the Village Preservation Foundation, which manages the annual festival. Members of the GPAF committee assist the foundation in hosting the festival.

Garrison Park pool will not open due to pandemic

In an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19, the Village Board during its meeting on April 27 approved not opening the pool at Garrison Park for the 2020 season. The decision was made following a majority of the board agreeing that social distancing guidelines would be difficult to implement at the pool.

All village parks will be open during the summer months.

"Now more than ever, in the midst of a national pandemic, our parks play an integral role in the quality of life for our residents by providing a natural resource for everyone to get fresh air and exercise, both essential elements for mental and physical well-being," said Mayor Deb Rogers.
