Members of the Society are involved in a variety of interesting and worthwhile activities.

Village Meeting House—A joint project with the Village of Williamsville to save and restore the former Church of Christ Disciples building, built in 1871, and to formulate guidelines for its use by the Historical Society and other community groups.

Williamsville Historical Society Museum—Opened June, 2000 containing village historical information and artifacts. Open afternoons 1 to 3 pm on the second Sunday of the month Sept. to June.

Photography—The collection, preservation, and display of photos depicting important people, places, and events in village history. On display in the museum.

Village Walking Tour—Comprehensive self-guided historic walking tour. Available at the Museum, through the Society and at Village Hall.

Oral History—Tape recorded interviews with older citizens to help document significant details of earlier village life. Available at the Museum for listening.

Historic Site Designation—Assist Village in the data necessary to include village sites and districts for inclusion in the Village, Town, State and Federal Registers of Historic Places.

Historic Resources Survey—The identification and classification of historic structures and districts within the village as a basis for future preservation efforts.

Society Meetings—Include programs of special interest, such as genealogy research, antique clocks, and landmarks of Village, Town, and County.
